A traditional Japanese haiku is a three-line poem with seventeen syllables, written in a 5/7/5 syllable count. Often focusing on images from nature, haiku emphasizes simplicity, intensity, and directness of expression.

Two Islands fighting: It is a piece in video animation and wood engraving that goes from the autobiographical personal to the collective concerns. The two girls fighting symbolize the apparently irreconcilable differences between the two Cuban Island (inside - outside the island populations) and also the psychological contradictions of the Cuban being as an individual.

The pioneer girl personifies Cubans who reside on the island and are therefore obliged to abide by and suffer the problems of daily life and national politics imposed by totalitarianism. The naked girl personifies the emigrant Cubans who have broken with this past and started a new life in another context. Unfortunately, a social and national reconciliation among this two groups despite the deep family, cultural and sentimental relationships, every day seems more distant, product of political hostility on both sides, so we are all mired in that endless swirl of blame, mutual recriminations and almost insurmountable misunderstandings.
